Comment [01]: This is the date the evaluation is printed. Look for this first, if anything in your record has changed since this printing, the report is out of date.

Comment [02]: Shows you what catalog you are following - if advantageous, you can move to a newer catalog if you want.

Comment [03]: This usually shows credits that are in progress and pre-registered. If you currently have a course that has a grade of "incomplete" it will show up here.

Comment [04]: Remaining just means the number of credits required to reach 120 (after completion of in progress and pre-registered courses). Some majors will require that you complete more than 120, and many transfer students may exceed 120 as well.

Comment [05]: Occasionally, you'll see this as "1 course needed" even though you have completed EN 102. You don't need to "go backwards" to do EN 101. EN 102 is all you need. However, remember that if you start at the EN 101 level, you need a C or better in that class to move up to 102

Comment [06]: If you see HI 201 or 202 here, check to see if the social science requirement has been met some other way. If not, check "other courses" on the last page to see if HI 151 or 152 is there. Sometimes the evaluation will make it appear that you need another course when you really don't.

Comment [08]: IF one or both of these shows "1 course needed", remember to look in "other courses" at the end of the report to see if one is in progress or pre-registered. These don't show in the evaluation until both lecture and lab are completed successfully.

Comment [09]: There are some courses, such as HI/RE 322, that can be EITHER 300 religion OR interdisciplinary. Can't be both at the same time (or PSY 477 that can be interdisciplinary OR global awareness – same rule applies.
