More than 40 people learned how to use credit wisely at a Consumer Credit Counseling Service (CCCS, left in photo) of Hawaii session held at the Queen Liliuokalani Children's Center in Kaunakakai, Molokai, on Saturday, July 12. The session was conducted by John Nabers, educational outreach coordinator at CCCS.
