HOW LARGE A SCHOLARSHIP CAN I EARN?

300 hours of service = \$1,175
(1 year to complete)

450 hours of service = \$1,468
(1 year to complete)

900 hours of service = \$2,775
(2 years to complete)

WHAT ACTIVITIES QUALIFY?

- Academic & co-curricular service-learning
- Non-paid, academic internships with a service-focus
- **Practicum hours such as nursing, counseling, firefighting, student teachers who qualify, etc.**
- Community service in the areas of education, public safety, environmental initiatives, community development, and human services
- Most volunteer work including tutoring, mentoring, stream restoration, & volunteer recruitment

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Students at an eligible Higher Education Institution **enrolled at least half-time**

- Anyone who volunteers in a non-profit and is not receiving any pay (unless you are a **Federal Work Study** student & in a service position)

This includes all **Education Majors, Nursing, Medical, Dental, Social Work, Counseling Psychology, Health Promotion, Service Learning and Social Sciences students who do clinical, practicum, service learning, student teaching** or just want to volunteer in a service setting within the community

- You must be a:
US Citizen, US National, or Legal Permanent Resident Alien



HOW DOES IT WORK?

- Log on to:

- Go to the **INFO FOR: STUDENTS** link, click on it and read the Pre-Service Overview and then **complete the Reflection Questionnaire as you will need to bring it with you to an in-person orientation.**
- Download the Enrollment Paperwork. **Please wait to complete the paperwork until you attend an in-person orientation.** We will explain in detail how the forms need to be completed in order to be in compliance with program policy.
